The course proposes to take a deep-dive into the public policy formulation and implementation, taking the students through the intricacies of public policy in practice. The course exposes the students to structures, institutions, and organizations in practice primarily pertaining to Panchayat Raj, Rural Development, Education, Health and Institution Building. It would also organize field immersion to the students to let them feel the realities on ground, and shape their perspectives about people and problems.

The course will be administered by the Centre for Research in Schemes and Policies (CRISP) formed by 10 senior civil servants who worked at the level of Secretary to Government of India / Chief Secretary. CRISP is already working with 7 State Governments in shaping up their programmes and policies in the social sector.

The Module will supplement the courses being taught at the Kautilya School of Public Policy on Foundations of Public Policy, The City (relating to Urbanisation) and Introduction to Public Problem Solving. This will be done through exposure to real life situations captured in the field. The course would be delivered by senior most civil servants (Founding Members of CRISP) using case studies that link up to the theory of public policy. It will be anchored by Mr R. Subrahmanyam to ensure linkages between various modules and case studies.

Learning ObjectiveS

- 1. Exposure to operational issues in public policy and the realities of development administration.
- 2. To enhance the ability to critically analyze complex policy issues, identify underlying problems, and understand their root causes while also considering ethical implications of policy alternatives.
- 3. To develop collaborative approaches so as to build consensus in policy processes.
- 4. To understand relevant legal frameworks, regulations, and imbibe concepts that would be useful for students as they transition to being policy makers.

This unit will help students to understand various factors of Poverty alleviation in rural

Unit II	Sessions: 7	Rural Development Module
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This unit deals with Rural development agenda and will be taught using various case studies by Mr. T Vijay Kumar. He will focus on Self Help Groups and National Rural Livelihood Mission and look at "Natural Farming" as the key driver of sustainable development in rural India. The case study on MGNREGA and Swatch Bharat Mission by Mr R. Subrahmanyam and Ms. Rekha will help students understand practical challenges in implementing public policies for rural development. Mr RS Julania will take a session on minor irrigation to delve deeper into the challenges of farming. The exposure to the land administration which is crucial for the rural development schemes would be covered in the final session of the module.

III	Sessions: 6	Module on Education and Health

This unit focuses on issues of Education and Health. It aims to enable students to analyze policies such as the 'New Education Policy 2020' and to further understand the existing issues in the school level educational policy making. Smt. Sandhya Kanneganti will focus on the case study of teacher transfers in the state of Andhra Pradesh to understand the policy making process in the school level educational policies. The unit also takes a look at healthcare in light of the Covid19 Crisis. By making use of a case study of the oxygen shortage during the Covid Crisis in Maharashtra by Mr Sitaram Kunte this unit aims to enable students to understand the intricacies in healthcare access in the country.

Subba Rao will focus during the course of his lecture on the issue of integrating skills in higher education. Further, transparency and accountability mechanisms in the domain of skills and employment will be covered in this unit. The case studies will be on Urban Employment Guarantee Scheme and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Scheme.
